

**Draft Meeting Minutes

1. Introduction and Welcome

2. Approval of Draft Agenda, September 29, 2008

The agenda for the September 29, 2008 meeting (PDF-R 2008-011) was approved as presented. (Rosenthol/Newman)

3. Approval of Draft Meeting Minutes, September 8, 2008

The draft meeting minutes from the September 8, 2008 meeting (PDF-REF 2008-010) were approved as presented. (Rosenthol/Newman)

4. Discussion of ISO 32000-2 Features

Leonard Rosenthol reported that he completed work on the US submission of features to be recommended for inclusion in ISO 32000-2. The recommendations will be distributed by AIIM to the ISO member countries prior to the meeting.

The committee spent the remainder of the meeting time discussing the proposals from the UK and Germany.

The UK proposal includes additions from the PDF/X committee and is fully supported by the US committee.

The German proposal includes three separate proposals:

- Use of blackpoint compensation which addresses a lack of control and adds a new key. The US agrees to accept this recommendation.
- Multiple output intents and color conversion instructions – PDF was built around color management profiles. Readers are required to process color in a color managed manner through the use of profiles. No problems are encountered unless the specific output device is specified. PDF/X requires the specific output intent be specified while ISO 32000-1 does not require this. The question is whether PDF should respect the output intent like PDF/X or not.
- PDF-VT – The intent of this is to create sub-group intents. There is a known flaw in ICC processing with conversion of CMYK to CMYK in that you get color bleeds. Workarounds to this problem have been developed in software. Adobe's product does not support multiple or color intents. The US believes this recommendation should be addressed by sending the issue back to the ICC ISO committee to resolve the issue. ISO 32000-2 should include a pointer to the ICC solution to this issue.

Cherie Ekholm will be the US spokesperson for the Beijing meeting.

5. Other Business

The next meeting will be on November 13, 2008 at 1 p.m. Eastern (10 a.m. PST). The intent of this meeting is to report back to the committee on the outcome of the meeting in Beijing.
