After losing her father to gun violence at age 12, Micarah's family faced financial hardship and uncertainty. From Refugee Camp to Future in Medicine

Apshara's journey from a Nepalese refugee camp to pursuing a career in medicine is a testament to her resilience and determination. Arriving in the U.S. at age 8, Apshara faced significant challenges but excelled academically, driven by her mother's emphasis on education. With support from Boys Hope Girls Hope of Colorado's Academy, she earned her Certified Nurse Aide license at 16 and a degree in molecular biology from the University of Denver at 20. Now a health analyst pursuing a master's in public health, Apshara remains committed to becoming a doctor and actively gives back to her community. Reflecting on her journey, she says: "I thought, 'These are the people that are going to guide me.""



Dwayne's dream of becoming a doctor was fueled by his sister's battle with retinoblastoma, a rare eye cancer. Through Boys Hope Girls Hope of Baltimore, he demonstrated resilience ultimately earning his medical degree from Howard University. Now on the cusp of starting his General Surgery residency with the US Navy, Dwayne reflects on his journey with gratitude and a commitment to giving back.
